# "You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows." ~ Psalm 23:5

The last place an animal like a sheep would want to pause to eat would be in the presence of its enemies, unless that sheep completely trusts its shepherd.

God nourishes us even when we feel vulnerable, even when there is danger nearby. And we are fed so that we have the energy to follow our callings. Annointing was a symbol of both healing and calling. God sets us aside for a purpose and guides us along that path.

For this prayer, we invite you to use a bit of oil to make a sign of the cross on your forehead or on the back of your hand, or ask someone else to do it for you. As you make the sign, remember that you belong to God and that God shepherds you and calls you his own.
