SCRITPURE READING

Romans 12:2-12

New Revised Standard Version

Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect.

For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of yourself more highly than you ought to think, but to think with sober judgment, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned. For as in one body we have many members, and not all the members have the same function, so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another. We have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us: prophecy, in proportion to faith; ministry, in ministering; the teacher, in teaching; the exhorter, in exhortation; the giver, in generosity; the leader, in diligence; the compassionate, in cheerfulness.

Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good; love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honor. Do not lag in zeal, be ardent in spirit, serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer.

Prayer for Peace

Great God, who has told us "Vengeance is mine," save us from ourselves, save us from the vengeance in our hearts and the acid in our souls.

Give us the strength it takes to listen rather than to judge, to trust rather than to fear, to try again and again to make peace even when peace eludes us.

We ask, O God, for the grace to be our best selves.
We ask for the vision to be builders of the human community rather than its destroyers.
We ask for the humility as a people to understand the fears and hopes of other peoples.

We ask for the love it takes to bequeath to the children of the world to come more than the failures of our own making. We ask for the heart it takes to care for all the peoples as well as for ourselves.

Give us the depth of soul, O God, to constrain our might, to resist the temptations of power to refuse to attack the attackable, to understand that vengeance begets violence, and to bring peace--not war--wherever we go.

For You, O God, have been merciful to us. For You, O God, have been patient with us. For You, O God, have been gracious to us.

And so may we be merciful and patient

and gracious and trusting with these others whom you also love.

This we ask through Jesus, the one without vengeance in his heart. This we ask forever and ever. Amen

PRAYER OF INTERCESSION

You are a God of hospitality;

there is none like you that invites all to come to you.

You have invited all to your home, to your table, and to your arms.

Lord, would that all would hear and receive this good news.

Lord, help us to remember that no one is better than anyone else in your Kingdom.

Help us to then treat each other the way you treat people.

Because you treat us with your tender love, We take time to pray for our friends, family members and others who need you more than ever. (pause and lift up each name)

Pour out your healing on all who need it. Be generous with your transforming love for those who needs it in their lives. Bring forth your reconciliation in families, and in places where it is needed.

Gifting God,

You give us the gifts of the spirit to use to further your Kingdom and to be the Body of Christ in the world.

We take time to remember the people devastated the violent murders in Atlanta.

Let us name how these murders are rooted in racism, white supremecay, a history of misogyny and stereotyping directed at Asian women.

Empower us to continue to be your hands and feet

to continue the work that needs to be done to confront the roots of racism and xenophobia in our midst, and even in ourselves.

There is none like you God in your love, your generosity, your gifting and your hospitality.

And we thank you that you are in our lives, working in us and through us to let people know your kingdom is open to all. In the name of your Son, who opened the doors for all and broke down barriers that kept people from you, and taught us to pray:

LORD'S PRAYER

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever. Amen

PRAYER FOR THE OFFERING

In deep gratitude for all that You have done for us, we offer ourselves and our gifts to You—living sacrifices of worship and praise.

Transform our hearts and minds from the inside out; show us what is good and pleasing in Your sight, so that we may be quick to recognize Your call, and quick to respond.
