Dear PVEC Community: August includes its fair share of obscure "holidays" including National Catfish Month, Friendship Week, and <u>Bad Poetry Day</u>. This month is also your chance to celebrate National Make-A-Will Month.

Here's why you need a will:

1. It's an important legal document that everyone should have; a powerful document that lets you distribute your property and protect your loved ones after you pass away.

2. It provides peace of mind to you and your family. Wills aren't just for the rich and famous. They make life (and death) easier for everyone, regardless of socioeconomic status. You may not think you own a lot, but you likely have more property than you realize: your home, vehicles, furniture, clothing, books, sentimental items, and more. Creating a will ensures your assets go to the people you most want to have them. With a will, you can also plan ahead for those who are in your care (children, pets).

3. It lets you create a legacy that lasts beyond your lifetime. None of us live forever. But there are ways to continue making a positive impact on this world long after you leave it. One of these ways is by donating to your church in your will. You can give cash, stock, real estate property, and more. Leaving a gift for PVEC in your will costs you nothing during your lifetime, but will ensure that you can make a positive impact on causes close to your heart for years to come.

<u>Here is a way of giving to the church while you're still alive (and save income tax).</u> If you are 70 ½ or older you can call your broker and ask them to send a QCD (Qualified Charitable Distribution) to you with a check payable to Panther Valley Ecumenical Church. In this way, you get to pay your pledge and satisfy your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) from your IRAs; thus saving yourself from paying federal income tax on the money! (I do this quarterly). The one rule is that you need to have the church cash the check before 12/31, so don't delay! Our website <u>www.PantherValleyChurch.org</u> under the WAYS TO GIVE tab explains several ways in which you can financially support our ministries. You too, can be the hands and feet of Jesus - We will do great things for others in need with your money!

PVEC's doors are open for in-person worship! Pew cushions are now in place, and our Bibles are back in their rightful holders. Masks are required (as singing is now happening). We gather in the sanctuary at 10:30 a.m. on Sunday but will continue to stream our services for those who do not feel comfortable coming into the sanctuary at this time.

PVEC's Current Outreach to both our Members and Community:

1. Youth Group activities are starting (ages 10 and up) September 24th with Theater Skit Night (6-8pm)

2. Contemplative Morning Prayer (8:30 – 9:00) is available on our website or Wednesdays in our sanctuary

3. Christian Outreach is holding its annual Backpack program for school supplies to needy families in our area. We are collecting: Spiral notebooks, crayons, pens and pencils, glue sticks, pocket folders (in solid colors). Also Small bag treats: goldfish crackers, pretzels, saltine crackers, or anything similar (they just need to be nut-free). All can be dropped off in the Narthex or outside the office downstairs

4. Our Food Pantry continues to be a place where we nourish individuals and families in need with grocery bags filled with frozen food, canned and packaged goods, and much needed household items.

5. We continue to offer our \$5 Take-out Chicken Dinner once per month - next one is September 9

6. "Friends and Neighbors of Allamuchy" will be using both PVEC's indoor and outdoor facilities to hold their Mega Event on September 25. Tricky Tray, Raffles, Yard Sale, Food – sounds like fun!
