# **HONEST QUESTIONS, COMPASSIONATE RESPONSE**

In our Gospel scripture today, we will hear about the unproductive fig tree. It has been three years, where is the fruit? If it doesn't happen within the "expected" time frame, then it is a failure? Whose fault is it? What happens when our lives don't follow the "life-script?" The gardener offers an alternative medicine – patient, hope-filled tending. Lying fallow and getting fertilized with laughter and tears at the crappy stuff of life can help heal what ails us. What parts of your life feel fruitless? How might you tend to your own life and allow the Gardener to love you? Let us take a moment of silent reflection...

Silent Reflection

Hear this compassionate word from Isaiah: "Everyone who thirsts, come to the waters; and you that have no money, come, buy and eat! Come, buy wine and milk without money and without price." Know that already, God is offering us love enough. We are invited to release oppressive expectations of ourselves and others so that we might recognize true worth afforded to all. And know, that despite our sometimes faltering steps, in the name of Jesus Christ, you are being forgiven, even now.

ALL: In the name of Jesus Christ, you are forgiven. Glory to God! Amen.

## Gospel Reading Luke 13: 1-9

At that very time there were some present who told him about the Galileans whose blood Pilate had mingled with their sacrifices. He asked them, "Do you think that because these Galileans suffered in this way they were worse sinners than all other Galileans? No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all perish as they did.

Or those eighteen who were killed when the tower of Siloam fell on them—do you think that they were worse offenders than all the others living in Jerusalem? No, I tell you; but unless you repent, you will all perish just as they did."

Then he told this parable: "A man had a fig tree planted in his vineyard; and he came looking for fruit on it and found none. So he said to the gardener, 'See here! For three years I have come looking for fruit on this fig tree, and still I find none. Cut it down! Why should it be wasting the soil?'

He replied, 'Sir, let it alone for one more year, until I dig around it and put manure on it. If it bears fruit next year, well and good; but if not, you can cut it down."

# **Stewardship Snippet (Third Sunday in Lent - Year C)**

March 20, 2022 - Isaiah 55: 1-2

You there! Everyone who thirsts, come to the waters; And you who have no money come, buy and eat. Come, buy wine and milk without money and without cost. Why do you spend money for what is not bread,

And your wages for what does not satisfy? Listen carefully to Me, and eat what is good, And delight yourself in abundance.

Isaiah asks, Why do you spend money for what is not bread, And your wages for what does not satisfy (NASB)? Even though this verse was written 900 years before Christ, it could easily be a question Ninabeth might ask in this week's sermon. How is it that we have become so consumed with buying more and more things when neither food nor things ultimately satisfy us? Is it because we have believed the lie that things make us happy? If this is true, why did John D. Rockefeller admit, "I have made many millions, but they have brought me no happiness." Henry Ford confessed after becoming a multimillionaire, "I was happier doing a mechanic's job." Isaiah was right to ask why we buy what will not satisfy. **Think about it**. Donna Weinberg
